Best of Show Awards -

Four Rosettes will be given one in each of the following categories: canning, baking, sewing and quilts.

Limit 1 entry per class per exhibitor.

All exhibits must be made by exhibitor.

Exhibits must have been produced or made since October, 2008, except quilts.

Exhibits may not be entered a second time.

Canned foods and soft spreads may be opened by the Judges.

All entries must be made from scratch. No bought mixes.

No prepared dough except class 2456.

Exhibits that appear to be divided between more than one exhibitor will be disqualified. For example, a cake or batch of cookies that have been divided and exhibited in more than one exhibitors name.

Youth cannot exhibit in youth and adult classes with the same product.

CANNED FOODS

1. All canned foods must be in a standard mason-type, clear-glass jar with a self-sealing, two piece lid.
2. Jars must have a vacuum seal and screwbands.
3. Jars must be legibly labeled with the following information:
 - Product: specify name of canned food.
 - Date Processed: month and year (all products must be less than 1 year old).
 - Method of Processing: specify either boiling water bath, simmering water bath or pressure canned with pounds pressure noted.
 - Time Processed: in minutes.

Example of a qualified label:

Snap Beans
7/09
Pressure Canned, 10 lbs.
25 minutes

4. Entries must be canned according to USDA Food preservation guidelines, available at the University of Missouri Extension Center.
5. Quarts and pints of fruits, vegetables, pickled food, and sauerkraut may be entered. Half-pints and pints of sweet spreads (jams and jellies) may be entered.
6. Headspace requirements are as follows:
 - Fruits: 1/2 inch
 - Vegetables: 1/2 to 1 inch
 - Sweet spreads: 1/4 inch for jellies; 1/2 inch for all others
 - Pickles: 1/2 inch
7. The following entries will be disqualified:
 - a. paraffin sealed sweet spreads
 - b. jars with zinc lids
 - c. foods in green glass jars or non-standardized jars
 - d. jars without a vacuum seal
 - e. improperly processed or packed foods (see nos. 3-6 above)
 - f. jars with more than 2 inches of headspace
 - g. jars with improper or no label
