**Premiums Offered - \$6,000**

#### Rules-

1. Premiums in this department is provided by the SEMO District Fair Association.
2. All Dairy Cattle arrives by 1 pm Saturday, Sept. 12. Health papers are to be checked on arrival. Other Livestock will not be accepted after 6 pm, Tuesday, September 15, 2009. Health papers on applicable animals will be checked by the veterinarian on Tuesday from 5 pm to 6 pm.
3. All judging will be done by the group system which will include blue, red-and-white-ribbon groups. Premium money offered in this department will be divided on the basis of 3-2-1; that is, an exhibit placing in the blue-ribbon group will receive three (3) time the amount received by an exhibit placing in the white-ribbon group; an exhibit in the red-ribbon group will receive twice that given to a white-ribbon exhibit in the same class.
4. The prize money will be divided according to the number of winners in the show. Blue, red, and white ribbon winners will receive points indicated in the premium list. The total points awarded will be divided into the total money to determine the value of a point.
5. In no case shall a point be equal to more than fifty-five cents (55 cents.)
6. In all classes, the Judges; decision will be final.
7. All animals exhibited must comply with the Health and Sanitation Requirements as set out in the General Rules and Regulations.  
**General Regulations-**
  1. All premiums will be paid directly by the SEMO District Fair.
  2. Open only to SEMO FFA members enrolled in one (1) of the following types of supervised agriculture programs during the school year:
    - a. Regularly enrolled students in vocational Agriculture classes in high school.
    - b. Active members of FFA chapters who are continuing their supervised agriculture program (active member as defined by the National Constitution)
    - c. All entries entered in the FFA Classes must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor for at least sixty (60) days prior to showing and be a part of his regular supervised agriculture program. The Agriculture Educator supervising the students is held responsible for the strict enforcement of this rule. Instructors must accompany their students to the show and be responsible for their conduct while there.
  3. Exhibitors limited to 2 entries per class unless otherwise specified. Entries must be made on official FFA entry forms available from local Vo-Ag Instructor, center of this premium guide, or fair website. The entry forms must be filled out in detail, signed by the Instructor or Agriculture Educator, and sent to Marilyn Schott, 7379 State Highway 72, Jackson, Mo. 63755. Entries must be postmarked on or before Tuesday, August 11, 2009.
  4. All FFA animals shown in the open division must be housed with the FFA exhibits. No livestock can be removed before 6:00 p.m. Saturday, September 19, 2009 except Market Lambs, Barrows, Steers & Goats sold at auction which are released at 11 pm Saturday, September 19, 2009.
  5. Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show and care for them. Animals must be presented before the Judges by FFA member unassisted by parent, teacher or breeder. In case of sickness or other conditions which make this impossible, animals must be cared for and exhibited by some other FFA member of the school.
  6. The Committee reserves the right to withhold premium money and/or send an FFA member home who displays unbecoming conduct.
  7. All FFA exhibitors are encouraged to wear official FFA coveralls, or FFA T-shirt.
  8. No commercial advertising of feeds or other agricultural products will be permitted in or around the pens or stall.
  9. All feed and bedding must be furnished by the exhibitor at his expense. **Beef cattle exhibitors are not to use straw for bedding - bark will be available. Dairy exhibitors may use straw.**
  10. Dairy Cattle must be in place by 1:00 pm Saturday, Sept. 12. Pens will be assigned. All other animals must be in place by 6 pm Tuesday, September 15. Pens will be assigned Monday, September 14. Under no circumstances are animals to be placed until you have consulted Superintendent. All animals shown in open class must comply with the Open Class Rules and Regulations. Individual animals can be released on applicable animals by the Superintendent in case of sickness. Veterinarian will check health papers from 5 to 6 pm. If exhibitor cannot be there at that time they can leave their health papers with Chairman Dan Burkemper. FFA Superintendent will check exhibitor entries on all livestock from 5 to 6 p.m. Registration papers must accompany registered animals.
11. No pen rent will be charged exhibitors in this department except as follows: All FFA livestock shown in open class must pay pen rent. Duplicate entries must be made. (See Rules for Open Class.) Send entry forms to Marilyn Schott 7379 State Highway 72, Jackson, MO 63755.
12. All pens must be kept clean and refuse disposed of as directed by Fair Committeemen and/or Superintendents.
13. Crops, FFA exhibits, and mechanics must be in place by 1 pm, Saturday, September 12 and remain until 6 pm Saturday, Sept. 19. Duplicate entries must be made in field crops if you plan to show in open class and FFA.
14. A Show Committee has been selected to assist in the management, planning and interpretation of the Show Rules. Their decision shall be final. Premiums will be forfeited for violation of these Rules.
15. See General Rules and Regulations concerning parking in livestock area.
16. All entries in breed classes must be registered animals except commercial classes and market steers and barrows. Registry number of animal or registry numbers of sire and dam must be on entry form.
17. Each instructor is held responsible to assure all animals are of show quality. Superintendents and the Show Committee reserve the right to reject any animals, subject to approval by SEMO District Fair Board.
18. Any breed not listed may be shown according to classes listed.
19. No animal may be exhibited in both 4-H and FFA, however, the same enterprise may be exhibited in both 4-H and FFA, as long as breeding animals are shown in one division (4-H or FFA) and non breeding animals exhibited in the other division (4-H or FFA).
20. Placement of livestock grooming chutes within the FFA building will have to meet the approval of the FFA/4-H Superintendent.

#### SPECIAL AWARDS -

**Agri Systems**, Cape Girardeau, & Jackson, MO, will present a herdsman trophy to an FFA member. The trophy will be awarded on the basis of FFA member's showmanship, cooperativeness, personal cleanliness, neatness and sanitation in and around the show area.

**Agri Systems**, Cape Girardeau, & Jackson, MO, will provide twelve (12) trophies to FFA members of chapters that are outstanding during Fair Week. Awards are determined by FFA Show Committee.

**Praxair**, Cape Girardeau, MO will provide an award for champion metal project.

**Ozark-Gas Eqp. & Supply, Inc.** will provide an award for the Grand Champion metal project.

**Fruitland Livestock Sales** will present a plaque to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion FFA Market Barrow; Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion FFA Market Lamb, and, first and second placing individuals in the Swine Carcass Judging Contest.

**CO-OP Service Center, Inc.**, Jackson, MO will present an award to the Champion and Reserve Champion Steer.

**Liley Custom Granite and Countertops** will present a trophy to the Grand Champion FFA Female in Beef, Dairy, Sheep & Swine.

**MFA Exchange**, Jackson, MO will give one (1) award in beef, one (1) award in dairy, one (1) award in sheep, and one(1) award in swine based on showmanship in FFA division.

**SEMO Pork Producers** will offer \$25 to the best showman in the FFA Swine Show, and \$25 to the FFA swine exhibitor who keeps the neatest pens and alleys. They will also present awards for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Barrow.

**Metalweld, Inc.**, of Dexter, Mo. will present a Deluxe Victor Journeyman Kit to the school with the Best Farm Mechanics Display based on total points. A Miller Welder will be presented to the second place school based on total points.

**Rules -**

Each exhibitor may have two (2) entries in each class. Champion ribbons will be given in each breed group for male and female; must have blue rating. Mark open entries to be housed in FFA Barn.

Registered animals must have original registration certificates available for inspection at the Fair. Commercial animals must have verification of age. All cattle must have a legible tattoo or brand identification and comply with the general livestock rules. **Bark will be available or bedding - do not use straw.**

**Special Rules -**

Champion ribbons will be given in each breed group for male and female. Mark open entries to be housed in FFA Barn.

1. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries per class.
2. Any other breeds may be shown under the same classification.
3. Barrows will be weighed. Barrows must weigh-in between 230 - 280 pounds or they will be sent home.

4. FFA barrows must also be entered in the Real-Time Carcass Show. They are not eligible to be shown in the Open-Breed and Crossbreed Barrow Show.

**You must pre-enter on open entry form. Rules and class information is found in Department 400.**

These barrows are also to be entered in the FFA Barrow Show. They will be eligible for the 4-H - FFA Show and Sale.

5. All Barrows will be evaluated by Real Time ultra sound.
6. Registered animals must have original registration certificates available for inspection at the Fair. Commercial animals must have verification of age. Registered and commercial swine must be identified by ear notch and comply with the general livestock rules, as stated in this Premium Guide.
7. **4-H Exhibitors 8-18 yrs. and FFA must be certified with Show Me Quality Assurance Program (SMQA) or they will not be allowed to show. If you are not certified contact your FFA Advisor or Extension Livestock Agent immediately. Send copy of SMQA certificate with entry form.**

## 4-H & FFA LIVESTOCK SALES

Sale Committee Chairman, Terry Birk

Sale time is 4:30 pm, Thursday, September 17

Sale order: Steers, Lambs, Goat Wethers, & Barrows

1. 4-H-FFA exhibitor may only sell 1 steer, 2 barrows or 2 lambs or 1 goat wether.
2. All eligible animals shown must be sold unless the 4-H/FFA member notifies Terry Birk in writing by 5:00 pm Wednesday that the animal will not be sold.
3. All steers, barrows, lambs and goat wethers shall be weighed-in at the fair on portable scales by the sale committee. Only members of the sale committee are allowed to read the official resale and show weight.
4. **Market animals that do not meet weight requirements will be sent home after the weigh-in Tuesday and are not eligible to show or be sold in the Livestock Sale.**
5. For sale eligibility, the animals must be shown in the 4-H/FFA Steer, Barrow, Lamb or Goat (wether) Show. Immediately after show, the superintendents shall provide the Livestock Sale Committee with the judging results. Sale order will be determined by show placings.
6. All animals consigned will be sold to the highest bidder.
7. Special T-shirt will be provided to 4-H/FFA exhibitors of market animals and is to be worn during the livestock sale.
8. 4-H & FFA exhibitors must maintain responsibility for their market animals until they are loaded on the trucks Saturday. In the case of resale animals, responsibility will be maintained to the time animals are slaughtered.
9. Sale animals must remain in their stalls or pens until release time of 11:00 am Saturday, September 19.
10. No animal shall be consigned if it was previously consigned to another 4-H or FFA sale.
11. The Livestock Sale Committee, along with the respective 4-H and FFA superintendents, shall have the authority to eliminate any animal from the sale that does not qualify in accordance with the rules set forth in this Premium Guide, subject to the approval of the SEMO District Fair Board.
12. Market sale is open to regular enrolled 4-H & FFA sheep, swine, goat or beef members as part of their supervised project.
13. Lambs, barrows, steers and goats do not have to be purebred.
14. **No white ribbon animals will be sold.**

## Market Steers

1. 4-H/FFA member must have his steer by March 1, 2009 and nominated by weight and identification at the Spring weigh-in designated by the Livestock Sale Committee.
2. Steers must be castrated and polled or dehorned before nomination.
3. Steers will be weighed Tuesday evening, September 15, and must weigh at least 1,000 lbs. to be eligible to show and be sold in the livestock sale.

## Market Lambs

1. 4-H/FFA members must have their lambs by July 1, 2009 and have them nominated with identifying number by July 15, 2009.
2. Lambs will be weighed Tuesday evening, September 15, beginning at 5:00 p.m.
3. Southdown and Cheviot lambs must weigh 80-120 pounds and all other breeds, 100-160 pounds to be eligible to show and be sold in the livestock sale.

## Market Barrows

1. 4-H/FFA members must have their barrows by July 1, 2009 and have them nominated with identifying number by July 15, 2009.
2. Barrows will be weighed Tuesday evening, September 15, beginning at 5:00 p.m.
3. Barrows must weigh 230-280 pounds for show and sale eligibility.
4. **4-H Exhibitors 8-18 yrs. and FFA must be certified with Show Me Quality Assurance Program (SMQA) or they will not be allowed to show. If you are not certified contact your FFA Advisor or Extension Livestock Agent immediately. Send copy of SMQA certificate with entry form, if you are an FFA exhibitor.**

## MARKET GOATS (WETHERS)

1. 4-H/FFA members must have their wethers by July 1, 2009 and have them nominated by identifying number by July 15, 2009.
2. Wethers will be weighed Tuesday evening September 15, beginning at 5:00 p.m.
3. Wethers must weigh 40-140 pounds for show and livestock sale eligibility.



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
