1. 4-H Superintendents will be receiving entries Saturday, September 12, 2009 from 8:00 a.m. - Noon at the 4-H Exhibit Hall. No entries accepted past Twelve Noon, Saturday, September 12, 2009.

2. Release Times:

Poultry Tent Exhibits-8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Sept. 15, 2009.

Market Barrows, Lambs, Steers and Goats sold through the sale -11:00 a.m. on

Saturday, Sept. 19. In 4-H Exhibit Hall -10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 20.

Superintendents and the SEMO Fair Board are not responsible for any articles left after 1:00 p.m. Sunday.

Admission to the fairgrounds on entry day Saturday, Sept. 12th will be charged starting at 11:00 a.m. Exhibitors entering the grounds between 11:00 a.m. and 12 noon with completed entry form will be admitted to fairground. Exhibitors wanting to unload at the 4-H Exhibit Hall must enter through the Livestock entrance and must be on the grounds before 10:30 a.m. After 10:30 a.m., exhibitors will have to park and get assistance to bring entries on the grounds. If you have questions call Patty Turner @ 573-243-8273 or the fair office @ 573-334-9250. PREMIUMS WILL NOT BE PAID ON EXHIBITS REMOVED BEFORE THE SPECIFIED RELEASE TIMES.

3. All exhibits except livestock poultry, and rabbits must be properly identified with entry tag available at the County Extension Center.

4. Entries are to have the approval of the County Extension Agent from the county where the exhibits originate.

5. Entries in this department are limited to the official 4-H members who have their enrollment on file with the County University of Missouri Extension Center. The official 4-H member must be at least eight (8) years of age before January 1, 2009 and not over 19 years of age before January 1, 2009.

6. Each exhibit shall be owned or made by the exhibitor and shall represent work accomplished with a 4-H project being carried as of July 1, 2009.

7. Entries will be accepted from Missouri counties in Southeast Region.

8. Exhibitors will be limited to a total of twenty (20) entries.

9. Exhibitors will be limited to three (3) entries in a project area except in rabbits, poultry, and livestock classes in which two (2) entries can be made. Beef Steer where one (1) entry can be made. In poultry, rabbits, swine, beef, sheep, goats, and dairy a total of six (6) entries can be made.

10. Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits, but neither the SEMO District Fair Association nor the 4-H Club Department will be responsible for any loss or damage.

11. All judging will be done on the group system which includes blue, red, and white ribbon groups. Premium money offered in this department will be divided on the basis of 3-2-1; that is, an exhibit placing in the blue ribbon group will receive three (3) times the amount received by an exhibit placing in the white ribbon group. An exhibit in the red ribbon group will receive twice that given to a white ribbon exhibit in the same class.

12. Premium money will be divided according to the number of exhibitors in the show. Blue, red, and white ribbon winners receive the points indicated in the premiums list. The total points awarded will be divided into the total money to determine the value of a point.

13. In no case shall a point be equal to more than fifty-five cents.

14. In all classes the Judge's decision will be final.

15. No exhibit shall be entered in both 4-H Department and general open classes except livestock (beef, dairy, swine, sheep, goats, and horses). Poultry, rabbits, pigeons and guinea pigs exhibited in 4-H classes cannot be shown in open classes.

16. Articles made in projects recognized by the County Extension will be accepted for exhibit. Their point value will be at the discretion of the Director of 4-H Exhibits. 4-Hers exhibiting at the Fair have to be in good standing with their Club. The Director of 4-H Exhibits has the right to reject any entries, upon the recommendation of a leader.

17. Posters accepted in ALL PROJECTS. Poster size is 14"x22".

18. Best of Show ribbons will be given in some project areas. No extra money.

19. No exhibits, including animals, may be exhibited in both 4-H and FFA, however the same enterprise may be exhibited in both 4-H and FFA, as long

as breeding animals are shown in one division (4-H or FFA) and non-breeding animals exhibited in the other division (4-H or FFA).

20. No articles made as a school project can be entered.

21. All 4-H entries in 4-H Exhibit Hall will be judged by Saturday, September 12, 2009 after 12 Noon.

22. 4-Hers may only sell one (1) steer or two (2) barrows, two (2) lambs or one (1) goat in the 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale.

23. If a 4-Her is unable to bring his animals to the Fair, he will be able to bring a total of 3 different exhibits (poster or notebook) in the 4-H Exhibit Hall. Use Clover Book Number as entry number. Point value of 3-2-1.

24. All animals in purebred breeding classes of beef and swine must be registered. Animals in commercial beef and swine classes and all dairy, sheep and goats classes must have verification of age.

25. All beef and dairy exhibitors will be given EQUAL amounts of space per head determined by the TOTAL NUMBER OF ENTRIES. Exhibitors are limited to the space measured and marked by the Superintendents. Exhibitors may display club signs and other appropriate items within their designated area.

26. Market animals (steers, barrows, lambs, goats) that do not meet weight requirements will be sent home after the weigh-in Tuesday, September 15 and are not eligible to show or sell.

Special Awards for Animal Exhibits -

Brown Co. Heating and Air Conditioning, Cape Girardeau, MO will give trophy for Grand Champion Guinea Pig.

Liley Custom Granite & Countertops, Marble Hill, MO, will present trophies to the Grand Champion 4-H Beef breeding classes and 3 Champion 4-H Dairy classes - Crossbred, Brown Swiss, and Milking Shorthorn.

CO-OP Service Center, Inc., Jackson, MO will give an overall Reserve Champion trophy in beef (steer) and overall Reserve Champion in Swine.

Dennis & Karen James will give two (2) cash awards in swine based on Showmanship, second place winners.

Dortha Strack will present a traveling Club Herdsman Award.

MFA Exchange, Jackson, MO, will give two (2) awards in dairy, two (2) awards in beef and two (2) awards in swine, two (2) awards in goats based on showmanship. One fourteen (14) years and over, and one under fourteen (14) years. A trophy will be given for the Grand Champion 4-H Rabbit. Also a trophy will be given to the winners of the overall showmanship for the 4-H Horse Show. Trophy to the winner of Showmanship Class in 4-H Draft Horse, Draft Mule, & Draft Pony Show.

Marvin Best Jr. Family will give a trophy to the Champion and Reserve Champion 4-H Market Goat.

Orscheln Farm & Home Supply, Inc., Cape Girardeau, MO, will give two (2) awards in sheep, based on showmanship. One fourteen (14) years and over, and one under fourteen (14) years. Will also give a trophy for Grand Champion bird in 4-H Poultry Division.

Purina Mills, Inc. and Straightway Farm Service, Inc., Jackson, MO, will give an overall Grand Champion trophy in beef (steer), swine (barrow) and sheep (market lamb), and a Champion trophy for Holstein and Jersey.

Sandstone Farm, Oak Ridge, MO, will present an Individual Herdsman Award in the Beef Division.

Shawneetown Feed and Seed will give (2) awards based on steer average daily gain contest.

Livestock Regulations-

1. Advance entry of livestock must be made and received by Marilyn Schott, 7379 State Hwy 72, Jackson, MO 63755 by August 11, 2009. These entries should be submitted on an Official 4-H Livestock Entry Form. A separate form must be used for entries in each Division. Forms are also available at your County Extension Center or on fair website. All livestock entries must be completely filled out and contain signature or they will not be accepted.

2. No stall rent will be charged for livestock entered only in the 4-H Division. Exhibitors may enter livestock in open classes. See Open Class rules. No premium money will be paid to 4-H members who remove animals before the established release time. All 4-H animals must be presented by the 4-H exhibitor before the Judges unassisted by parent, leader, or breeder. In case of sickness another 4-H member may substitute.

3. 4-H exhibitors of animals are asked to leave their health papers on applicable animals with their superintendents.

4. **Bedding - Beef Cattle exhibitors - Do not use straw for bedding; bark will be available. Dairy exhibitors may use straw.**

Special Rules-

- All entries must be made by August 11, 2009 to Marilyn Schott, 7379 State Hwy. 72, Jackson, MO 63755.
- All exhibits must be in place by 6 p.m., Tuesday, September 15, 2009.
- Exhibitors of beef steers must be regularly enrolled in a Beef Project 121.
- Exhibitors of beef breeding stock will be limited to 4-H club members enrolled in the Clover No. 121 Beef Projects and must have been raised by the member.
- Exhibitors must report to the Beef Superintendent before tie-in.
- Exhibitors will be limited to two (2) entries in a class, except in beef steer where one (1) entry is allowed. Total of six (6) entries accepted.
- Entries that arrive after 6 p.m. September 15, 2009, will not be accepted.
- Do not use straw for bedding. Bark will be available.**

- Beef exhibits cannot be removed until Saturday, September 19, 2009, 6:00 p.m.
- Point value for each entry is forty-five (45) for blue, thirty (30) for red and fifteen (15) for white.
- Beef exhibits shall not have been on a nurse cow after April 1, of the current year, except in junior and senior heifer calf.
- Purebred animals must have original registration certificates available for inspection at the Fair. Commercial animals must have verification of age. Purebred and commercial cattle must have a legible tattoo or brand identification and comply with the general & livestock health rules.
- Showmanship classes will be held after the Market Steer Show. All 4-Her's who have beef animals at the Fair in the 4-H Division are eligible.
- 14. Open carcass steer cannot be housed with 4-H Beef Exhibits.**
- Placement of livestock grooming chutes within the FFA Building & 4-H Shelter will have to meet the approval of FFA/4-H Superintendents.
- Tie-out is 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. Tuesday through Friday.

MARKET STEER SHOW

4-H Steer Show, Wednesday afternoon after FFA Steer Show

Eligibility Rules

- This section is open to regularly enrolled 4-H members carrying beef steer projects who have met all project requirements. It is limited to animals covered in the project recorded. 4-H members must be enrolled in the beef steer project on March 1, 2009.
- The steer must be born on or after January 1, 2008 to be eligible for the show.
- All members must have their animals by March 1, 2009. To be eligible for show, the steer must have been weighed at the Spring Weigh-in designated by the Livestock Sale Committee. Steers must be castrated and dehorned before the Spring Weigh-In. No horn outgrowth more than one-half inch long will be permitted at weigh-in time.
- Members may sell one (1) steer in the sale either in 4-H or FFA.
- Steers do not have to be purebred.
- All steers will be weighed on Tuesday, September 15, beginning at 5 p.m. on portable scales furnished on the grounds.
- Animals will be sold on the inweight. Steers must weigh 1,000 pounds or more on September 15, to be eligible to show and be in the sale.
- There will be a Grand Champion and a Reserve Grand Champion Steer. A Supreme Grand Champion and Reserve Supreme Grand Champion steer of the SEMO District Fair will be selected. The 4-H and FFA Grand and Reserve Champion steers will be eligible to compete for this award.
- Judging will be done on the group system which includes blue, red and white ribbon groupings.
- General livestock rules apply.
- Do not use straw for bedding. Bark will be available.**
- The 4-H Beef Superintendents shall have the authority to eliminate any animal

from the 4-H Show that does not qualify in accordance to rules set forth in this Premium Guide.

- All steers must be sold in the 4-H and FFA Livestock Sale unless the owner notifies Terry Birk, in writing by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 16 that the steer will not be sold. **No white ribbon animals will be sold.**
- All Official Livestock Entry Forms must be completed and received by Marilyn Schott, 7379 State Hwy. 72, Jackson, MO 63755, by August 11, 2009 (See Livestock Regulation 1).
- All entries must be tied in by 6 p.m., Tues., September 15, 2009.
- All steers will be shown in classes, divided by weight.

Judging Time/Wednesday Morning after 4-H/FFA Barrow Carcass Judging Contest.

4-H & FFA Carcass Judging Contest is held in conjunction with the Open Barrow Carcass Show.

Eligibility Rules -

1. Judging is done on the group system of blue, red and white ribbons.
2. Open to 4-H members enrolled in Clover Projects 181 by March 1, 2009.
3. Two Barrows (purebred or crossbred) may be shown in either 4-H or FFA, but not in both divisions.
4. 4-H barrows cannot be shown in the Open Breed -Crossbreed Show.
5. Members must have their barrow(s) by July 1, 2009, and have them nominated with identification by breed, color, ear notch, by July 15, 2009.
6. Compliance is required with General & Livestock Rules.
7. Barrows must be placed in pen by 6p.m. September 15.
8. Barrows will be weighed on the fairgrounds September 15. **Barrows must weigh between 230-280 pounds to be eligible to show and be sold in the 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale.** These barrows will be shown in four classes made up of equal numbers.
9. **All barrows weighing 230-280 pounds must be sold in the 4-H/FFA Market Sale, unless the owner notifies Terry Birk, in writing, by 5p.m. on Wednesday, September 16, that the barrow(s) will not be sold.**
10. All 4-H barrows must also be entered (no charge) in the Open Real Time Carcass Barrow Show. Entry for this is made on an Open Livestock Form. Rules and Class information in Dept. 400.
11. Entries must be received on or before August 11, 2009, to Marilyn Schott, 7379 State Highway 72, Jackson, MO 63755.
12. **4-H Exhibitors 8 to 18 years and FFA must be certified Show Me Quality Assurance Program (SMQA) or they will not be allowed to show. If you are not certified, contact your FFA Advisor or Extension Livestock Agent immediately.**

1. Animals of age 6 months or younger, halter broke and being bucket fed. Select and/or purchase a calf born between March 1 and June 1 of current project year within 2 weeks of birth. To show, calf should be at least 90 days old.
2. Beef, dairy, or crossbred calf accepted.
3. Compliance with 4-H Club Department Rules & General Livestock Rules is necessary. Point value for each entry is forty-five (45) for blue, thirty (30) for red, and fifteen (15) for white.
4. Members must be enrolled in Clover Project 135
5. Exhibitor is responsible for calf care during the Fair.
6. Showmanship ribbon will be given.
7. Calves will be tied with Dairy Cattle or Beef.
8. Exhibitor of calf must be age 8-12 4-H age. Exhibitors who have had their 13th birthday by Jan. 1, 2009 are ineligible.
