Class 1150. BARROW CARCASS -REAL TIME

Carcass evaluation will be done with Real Time Ultrasound machine by a certified tech and in cooperation with the University of Missouri, University of Missouri Extension and SEMO District Fair. Barrows will be divided into 2 classes by weight for judging.

Class 1151. BARROW CARCASS ON-FOOT

Judging in show ring Wednesday after FFA Barrow Show. Barrows will be divided into 4 classes by weight for judging on foot.

RULES

1. Limit 2 barrows per exhibitor. Pre-entry is required by August 12, 2008. No pen rent.
2. Compliance required with General, Livestock & Swine Department rules.
3. Barrows must be farrowed February 1, 2008 or after.
4. Real time barrows cannot be shown in Breed and Crossbreed Barrow Show nor pen of market hogs classes.

5. Barrows must weigh a minimum of 230 lbs. and maximum of 280 lbs. to qualify for carcass competition.
6. On-foot carcass show barrows must meet a minimum of 55% lean carcass through Real Time evaluation for eligibility in on-foot class. Weigh-in and measurements for carcass contest will be Tuesday, 5 - 8 p.m., sponsored by SEMO Fair officials.
7. 4-H & FFA market barrows must also be entered in classes 1150 and 1151 on an open classes entry form in addition to 4-H or FFA market barrow class on their respective forms. These barrows remain eligible for the 4-H/FFA Market Barrow Sale.
8. Real Time barrows are released for market after the on-foot show Wednesday, except champion on-foot and carcass barrows, and barrows for the 4-H/FFA Sale which are released Saturday, 3:00 p.m.
9. Certification of Level III Pork Quality Assurance is required on all barrows going to market. This includes barrows sold in the 4-H/FFA Market Sale and those are sold privately. 4-H exhibitors 9 to 18 years of age and all FFA and adult exhibitors must be certified. All exhibitors under 9 years old on January 1, 2008, will need their parent's certificate. If you are not certified, contact your FFA Advisor or Livestock Agent immediately.
